

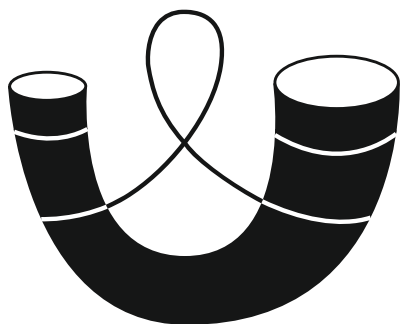

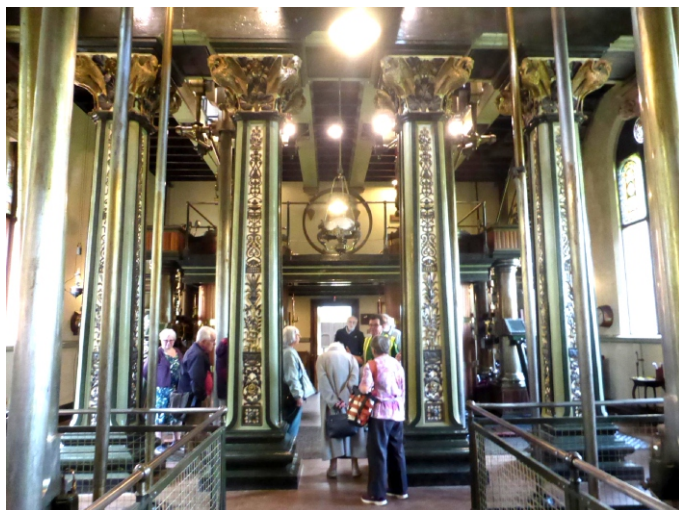

As a member of The Thoroton Society you can expect:

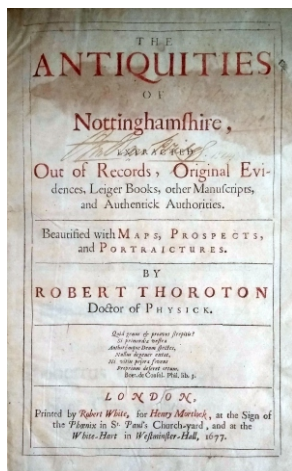
- Monthly lectures on topics relating to the county (Saturdays during autumn and winter).

The Thoroton Society is named in honour of Dr Robert Thoroton (1623-1678), a physician from Car Colston near Bingham, who published the first history of the county, the *Antiquities of Nottinghamshire*, in 1677.

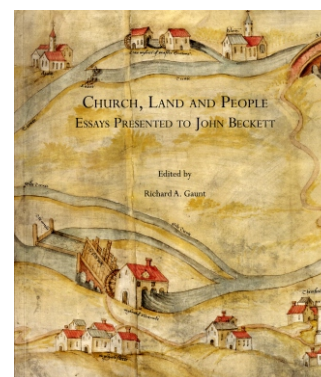


Professor Carenza Lewis giving a Thoroton Society lecture on the archaeological evidence for the impact of the Black Death in England.

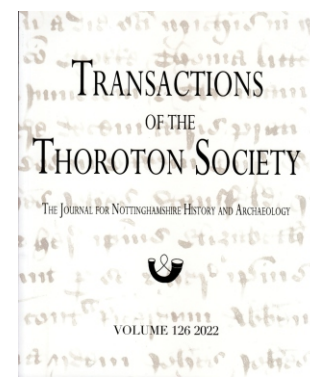


Architectural historian, Pete Smith, describes one of Nottingham's finest Georgian houses to a rapt audience of Thoroton Society members.

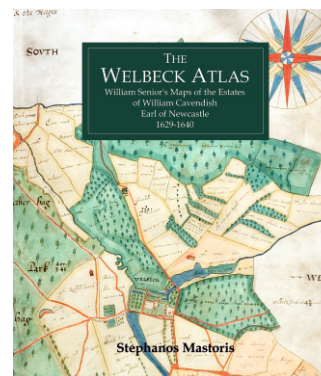
