


HOPPER BUS INFORMATION

People's Histreh are a group of people interested in what has been called "history from below" or "grassroots history". As Nottingham and Nottinghamshire have such a long and turbulent history of socio-economic transformation and disturbance and conflict, there is a lot to be unearthed. In fact, the most amazing, inspiring, shocking and outrageous stories leap out wherever the surface is scratched.

103 Foresters: Mutinies and Death Sentences in the Local Regiment – 1914-18

Since the start of 2014, People's Histreh have been working on a very extensive research project about those soldiers who served in the local regiment (then known as the Sherwood Foresters).

They have identified 103 Foresters, two thirds convicted for their alleged involvement in mutinies, the others sentenced to death for various offences. Eight of these soldiers were executed by firing squad.

In this talk, they will give you an overview of their research, outline our general take on the subject matter and present a few of their findings.


